ADN-RN to BSN Online Program 32 Credit Hours | One-Year Program

NFCC's Bachelor of Science in Nursing online bridge program is designed for Registered Nurses who have completed an Associate in Science Degree in Nursing (ADN-RN) and desire to enhance their credentials with a baccalaureate degree. To be eligible for the BSN program, students must have a current RN license from the state of Florida or a Multistate Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) and an ADN-RN degree.

The program is designed to further the development of the professional role of associate degree prepared RNs by building on knowledge from liberal education, biophysical sciences and associate degree nursing curriculum. The curriculum incorporates critical thinking and evidence-based scholarship to prepare baccalaureate nurses for system leadership with quality and safety as priorities. For effective inter-professional collaboration, communication and patient advocacy, students will explore healthcare policies, regulatory agencies and financial responsibilities of the baccalaureate nurse. The program also promotes the use of technology in delivering professional nursing practice and management of health information to prevent illness and promote health among diverse patient populations and communities.

4. Current, unencumbered RN license from the state of Florida or a Multistate Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC)
5. Foreign language requirement, as defined in Rule 6A-10.02412, F.A.C. (ADN-RN graduates will be required to demonstrate foreign language competence before or after baccalaureate program admission.)
6. Gordon Rule requirement as defined in Rule 6A-10.30.F.A.C.
7. Civic Literacy Competency as defined in Rule 6A-10.02413
