

# **NORTH FLORIDA COLLEGE QUICK VISUAL REFERENCE GUIDE**

This document provides the basic guidelines for North Florida College's graphic identity program, in order to maintain consistency throughout the system.

#### SEAL



#### **CLEAR SPACE:**

Clear space frames the logo, separating it from other elements and keeping it uncluttered, preserving the logo's integrity.

The approximate <u>height</u> of the axe blade in the NFC seal should be used as the *minimum* clear space.



MINIMUM SIZE: When used, should always remain at least 1.25" width for legibility.

#### **CLEAR SPACE:**

The approximate <u>height</u> of the "North Florida College" text in the logo should be used as the *minimum* clear space.





#### MINIMUM SIZE:

When used, should always remain at least *1*" width on the stacked logo and *1.5*" width for the horizontal logo for legibility.

#### **Other Accent Typefaces**

If using an accent typeface in this manner, be thoughtful in the choice of typeface to assure it coordinates well with your subject matter and complements the piece's design and NFC's overall brand.
